



May Land & Ocean Surface Mean Temp Anomalies NCDC/NESDIS/NOAA


Analysis is based upon Smith et al. (2008) methodology.

(with respect to a 1971-2000 base period)



Precipitation Anomalies May 2011


(with respect to a 1961-1990 base period)





Deadliest Tornado in Modern History Devastates Joplin, MO





- Corn and wheat production reduced 3.8% and 5.5% from 1980 to 2008
- Cities like Chicago may experience over 2,000 deaths/year from heat waves
- Global seaports unprepared to deal with rising sea levels

Ecosystems Impacted

Arctic reindeer populations may be stunted by limited access to winter food supplies



Coral reefs expected to be severely degraded by 2100 due to acidifying oceans

North Pacific loggerhead turtle populations decline while Northwest Atlantic populations expand under changing climates
